III. THE MEANING AND SAVING SIGNIFICANCE OF THE RESURRECTION

653 The truth of Jesus' divinity is confirmed by his Resurrection. He had said: "When you have lifted up the Son of man, then you will know that I am he."523 The Resurrection of the crucified one shows that he was truly "I AM", the Son of God and God himself. So St. Paul could declare to the Jews: "What God promised to the fathers, this he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus; as also it is written in the second psalm, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you."'524 Christ's Resurrection is closely linked to the Incarnation of God's Son, and is its fulfilment in accordance with God's eternal plan.

654 The Paschal mystery has two aspects: by his death, Christ liberates us from sin; by his Resurrection, he opens for us the way to a new life. This new life is above all justification that reinstates us in God's grace, "so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." Justification consists in both victory over the death caused by sin and a new participation in grace.526 It brings about filial adoption so that men become Christ's brethren, as Jesus himself called his disciples after his Resurrection: "Go and tell my brethren."527 We are brethren not by nature, but by the gift of grace, because that adoptive filiation gains us a real share in the life of the only Son, which was fully revealed in his Resurrection.

<u>A HIDDEN LIFE</u>

In the final paragraph of *Middlemarch*, the novelist George Eliot pays tribute to the people who keep the world moving forward in small yet indispensable ways: "The growing good of the world is partly dependent on unhistorical acts; and that things are not so ill with you and me as they might have been, is half owing to the number who lived faithfully a hidden life, and rest in unvisited tombs".

In other words, there are millions of people out there who, though they may not be remembered or known by you and me, made a difference for the people they encountered in their daily lives.


These lines fit with the hidden life of an Austrian farmer, Franz Jagerstatter, a Catholic gentleman whose sense of morality clashed with the times of his life. He was a principled devout man who objected to evil, and stuck by this objection, even in the face of certain death.

When Austria was annexed by Nazi Germany, Franz was mustered into the German army. By the middle of 1940, the European continent was secured, so farmers were allowed to go home. Franz became aware of the atrocities of the Nazi regime, and actively resisted rejoining the army as the war escalated with the entry of the United States. He would prefer to remain on the farm with his wife and three young daughters. After many delays, he was finally ordered to report for duty in the Wehrmacht. He dutifully entered the garrison, but when it came time to swear the oath, not to Germany, but to Hitler, Franz refused. He offered to become a medic, but that too required an oath of allegiance to *der Fuehrer*. He was arrested and held in prison awaiting trial on a charge of undermining military morale.

His parish priest questioned why he was doing this. His bishop flatly told him that no one would benefit from his conscientious objection, and that no one would ever know of his principled stand. His lawyer wondered why he couldn't just mouth some meaningless words. The military judge at his trial repeated the theme that no one would ever know what he was doing, and that he would be forgotten. On August 9, 1943, six months after his arrest, Franz Jagerstatter was executed by guillotine in Brandenburg prison. He was 36 years old. Minutes before his execution, he was given the option to sign a document to save his life, but declined, rejecting any complicity with the Nazi regime. His last recorded words were, **"I am completely bound in inner union with the Lord."**

Little by little over the ensuing years, Franz Jagerstatter's hidden life came to light, mainly by publication of his letters from prison to his wife. His moral example and martyrdom led to his beatification in 2007. It is unlikely that we Knights of Columbus will ever be put to the test like Blessed Franz Jagerstatter. But we can take inspiration from him, and pledge to faithfully lead our own hidden lives, maybe lost to history, but making a real difference in the lives of those we encounter.


