

Flag Day

Flag Day is a holiday celebrated on June 14 in the United States. It commemorates the adoption of the <u>flag</u> of the United States on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The Flag Resolution stated "That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Flag Day was first proposed in 1861 to rally support for the Union side of the American Civil War. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation that designated June 14 as Flag Day. On June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday, beginning in the town of Rennerdale. On August 3, 1949, National Flag Day was officially established by an Act of Congress.

Flag Day is not an official federal holiday. Federal law leaves it to the discretion of the president to officially proclaim the observance. Title 36 of the United States Code, Subtitle I, Part A, Chapter 1, Section 110 is the official statute on Flag Day. The United States Army also celebrates its birthday on this date

Retiring a flag on Flag Day (June 14th) is a common and appropriate practice, as it's a day dedicated to honoring the flag and its significance. Many organizations, like the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), and Boy Scout Troops, hold flag retirement ceremonies on this day. To properly retire a Flag, the Flag Code states that a flag should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning.
