

Jon Bokuniewicz of St. Gerard's was the main celebrant of the Mass, with our own Faithful Friar, Fr. Michael Skrocki, concelebrating. Members of the Honor Guard also participated in the Mass. There was a dinner in the parish hall afterward with about forty Sir Knights and Devoted Ladies in attendance.

By the time this newsletter has been published, the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree District 2 meeting will have been held at St. John the Evangelist in Jackson on Saturday morning, Aug. 23. That would normally be the night of our regular assembly meeting, but many of our officers and members will be obligated to attend the Diocesan meeting instead, so we may waive our January meeting or conduct it in some informal fashion.

We will partner with the Lansing Assembly to plan another Blue Mass at St. Thomas Aquinas at some time in February to honor public safety/emergency responders.

The State K of C Convention on Mackinac Island will be May 21-22.

The Flag Retirement ceremony is scheduled here at the Columbus Hall on the eve of June 14, 2026, which is Flag Day.

There will inevitably be additional district and diocesan meetings, and possibly another 4<sup>th</sup> Degree exemplification, in the spring.

A committee has been formed to research and propose options for our tradition of presenting an individual chalice to the families of deceased Sir Knights. The cost of buying and engraving proper chalices has risen significantly. The committee will also explore possible fundraising opportunities to improve our financial posture for meeting necessary expenses and for charitable support for various programs or organizations that align with the mission of the Patriotic Fourth Degree.

And let's not forget the urgent need to recruit new members for the long-term sustainability of our Assembly!

715 The prophetic texts that directly concern the sending of the Holy Spirit are oracles by which God speaks to the heart of his people in the language of the promise, with the accents of "love and fidelity." St. Peter will proclaim their fulfillment on the morning of Pentecost. According to these promises, at the "end time" the Lord's Spirit will renew the hearts of men, engraving a new law in them. He will gather and reconcile the scattered and divided peoples; he will transform the first creation, and God will dwell there with men in peace.

My Brother Knights,

Every May there is a pilgrimage to Lourdes, France for the Military Service Members and Veterans. They go to Lourdes hoping for healing of physical problems and spiritual needs.

In 1858 Saint Burnadette experienced 18 apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mother Mary. The apparitions appeared over a several month period, known as the Holy Fortnight. Saint Burnadette was told by the Virgin Mother to drink the water and wash yourself with it.

That Holy Water continues to flow from the Grotto. There have been 200 million visitors to the site over the last 165 years, including 180 US Military Members and Veterans that visited in May of 2025. There have been 70 miracles confirmed by the Catholic Church.

Lourdes, France is the 5<sup>th</sup> most visited pilgrimage site in the world. Rome, the Holy Land, Our Lady of Guatemala, and Our Lady of Fatima are the most visited. There is also a place in Wisconsin called Our Lady of Champion near Green Bay where Adele Brice saw an apparition of the Virgin Mother who spoke to her about teaching the children the catechism. My wife and I visited there and enjoyed a special afternoon.

Many of the Military Members who visited Lourdes mentioned that regardless of any physical healing, they came away with a special encounter with Our Mother Mary.

I strongly suggest if you have the chance to visit any of these sites, it is worth the effort.
