

Officers from the Michigan State Council, members of Assemblies and Councils and other Catholics from around the state will visit the State Capitol in Lansing for a March for Life on Thursday morning, November 6. There will be a Mass in St. Mary Cathedral beginning at 9:30 a.m., a pre-rally concert on the Capitol steps beginning at 10:00, a March for Life rally with remarks from a variety of dignitaries beginning at 11:00, followed by the Michigan March for Life from the east lawn of the Capitol to the east side of the Michigan Hall of Justice, and back to the Capitol. The route will mostly use sidewalks and pedestrian overpasses to reduce street crossings or traffic disruptions. We encourage as many members as possible to attend. Praying for better weather than the last march in November 2023!


Our Bishop Albers Assembly #0496 will partner with Lansing Assembly #3334 to host our annual Honoring Veterans Day and Reflection dinner at the K of C Hall on Grand River Avenue on Saturday evening, November 8. The event will be catered by Cap's Kitchen in Lansing. Dinner begins at 6:00 p.m. Veterans or active military and their spouses will be free—all others are asked for a \$15 donation per person. Our Faithful Comptroller, Tim Perrone, will offer a presentation about the experiences of his uncle who served on the crew of a B-24 Bomber over Europe during WWII.

A committee led by SK Ken Watterson has engaged in research and discussions to develop recommendations for updating our tradition of presenting an individual chalice to the families of deceased Sir Knights. The cost of buying and engraving proper chalices has risen significantly in recent years, and there is concern that chalices presented in the past have not always been used as intended at the celebration of Masses. We have decided to purchase a sample of a much less expensive model to determine its suitability in hopes that we can continue this tradition in a practical, affordable, and respectful manner.

IV. The Spirit of Christ in the Fullness of Time

John, precursor, prophet, and Baptist







719 John the Baptist is "more than a prophet." In him, the Holy Spirit concludes his speaking through the prophets. John completes the cycle of prophets begun by Elijah. He proclaims the imminence of the consolation of Israel; he is the "voice" of the Consoler who is coming. As the Spirit of truth will also do, John "came to bear witness to the light. In John's sight, the Spirit thus brings to completion the careful search of the prophets and fulfills the longing of the angels. He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit. and I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God.... Behold, the Lamb of God.

720 Finally, with John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit begins the restoration to man of "the divine likeness," prefiguring what he would achieve with and in Christ. John's baptism was for repentance; baptism in water and the Spirit will be a new birth. 100
